

Facts About Women Veterans

According to the Department of Veterans
 Administration & the Department of Labor, Women comprise the fastest-growing segment of the Homeless Veteran population



• Female Veterans have a four times greater risk of homelessness compared to their civilian counterparts





The Initiative

- 1. The Homeless Women Veterans & Children Initiative formed nationwide in collaboration with other nonprofit 501(c)(3) corporations, to help bridge the gap between homelessness and affordable housing
- 2. We will obtain 2,000 foreclosed homes from Housing and Urban Development (HUD); VA, Agricultural Rural Development Housing; Cities; Counties; States; Banks; Tax Liens; and Private Owners under PC Real Estate Firm managed by Non-Profits
- 3. We are providing programs that can assist families to get all the needs met in a safe environment that will help heal our "Sheroes"
- 4. Eradicate homeless women veterans by **November 11, 2024** -Veterans Day!



The Initiative (cont'd)



- 5. Homeless Women Veterans & Children Initiative will launch and manage several Housing Programs throughout America
 - -To assist women veterans who are homeless
 - -To help prevent as many women veterans from becoming homeless
- 6. Dedicated to providing affordable housing
- 7. Educating veterans on becoming self-sufficient & homeowners through THE R.E.P.A.I.R PROGRAM



WHAT ABOUT THE CHILDREN!!!!!



- 1. 99% of shelters take parents BUT will not accept the veterans' children which creates a more exasperating issue predominantly resulting in dysfunctional family structures
- 2. Most states including Alabama and Texas will incarcerate the homeless women veteran and <u>take</u> their children
- 3. Mothers give up precious time and special irreplaceable moments with their children to join the military
- 4. Lack of support and preparation for transition out of the military, impacts mental and physical readiness, coping skills, and reintegrating back into civilian society, which causes women's veterans and their children to be four times more likely to become homelessness than their civilian counterpart



WHAT ABOUT THE CHILDREN!!!!!



- 5. Some children are not only separated from their parents but also subjected into foster care
- 6. Birmingham, AL VA homeless official stated that VA has no program in place that supports the children of veterans
- 7. Many homeless women and children, move between couches, cars, floors, motels, and other unstable and unsafe situations; although these women veterans has put their lives on the line for this country. Women veterans are trained to kill but not trained to live.
- 8. It's quite common for children to feel at fault causing mental anguish
- 9. According to the NIH (National Institute of Health) SAD (Separation Anxiety Disorder) is the most common type of anxiety disorder in children
- 10. HUD (Department of Housing and Urban Development) and VASH (Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing) HUD-VASH enrolls the largest number and largest percentage of Veterans who have experienced long-term or repeated homelessness; however there's no legislation protection for our homeless women veterans' children.

How Will We Accomplish Our Goal?



- 1. We will use the appropriate affordable housing model to provide these homes to homeless women veterans and their children that may be at risk of being homeless
- 2. Exclusively for Women Veterans, allowing more women veterans to have a home
- 3. Women Veterans will have the option to rent, buy, or lease with the option to purchase



Ianagement in this Process



- 1. All homes will be managed and maintained by a management team appointed by our board leaders of the PC Real Estate Firm
- 2. The PC Real Estate management team will handle all housing applications which will include the screening of credit, references, background check, and income verification to determine eligibility based upon a favorable outcome for the veteran
- 3. Our non-profit real estate firm will connect and work with HUD (Department of Housing and Urban Development) and the Department of Veterans Affairs to accept the VASH (Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing) Voucher
- 4. The VASH Voucher will allow a woman veteran to live in one of the rental homes under the non-profit, with the woman veteran only paying a percentage of the rent based upon their adjusted gross income

Management in this Process (cont'd)

- 5. We will also seek other funding opportunities to aid veterans with rental assistance
- 6. The PC Real Estate management team will work alongside the Department of Veteran Affairs, Community Leaders, Shelters, and Other Non-profits in many service areas to maintain a referral system and ongoing communication and support for all women veterans who enter into the Women Veterans MIA (Missing In America) Housing Initiative
- 7. We will partner with the Department of Veteran Affairs to provide self-sufficiency services and workshops for Veterans and Active-Duty Men and Women to attend



Our Objective

- 1. Our aim is to supplement what's missing in the housing system by alleviating policies that cause extended delays and lengthy waiting list in securing a home in America
- 2. The Homeless Veteran Women and Children Initiative is designed to align our potential homeowners with employment
- 3. Help veterans with Career Development, Emotional Intelligence, Innovation, Effective Interviewing Skills, Leadership, Financial & Credit/Budget Management, Entrepreneurship (for profit and non-profit), Real Estate, Proposal Writing, and Mentoring Further Supportive Service Purposes



The Initiatives Objectives

- 1. To prevent homelessness and provide a variety of Housing Initiatives, educational, charitable, and enhancement programs for veterans
- 2. To provide women veterans with Mental Health Services
- 3. To provide all women veterans with a means of getting supportive services and faith-based learning
- 4. To provide an environment that is conducive to elevating a woman veteran to her fullest potential
- 5. To increase the women veterans and incarcerated women veteran's-self-concept by 60% with the first year through cultural enrichment activities


